1. Wide debridement of forehead
 2. Nerves regenerate faster.
 3. Z-plastic of glabella
 4. Lac. bridge of nose do not make bad scars
Small glabella flap thinned to release eyelid
cont.
- on bone deformities of nose - go in these scars
& brought away bone externally to reshape.

Wire sutures over lead plates very
useful in raising septum & nasal bones
& holding ethmoid together

Upper canaliculus turned
down to reconstruct lower.

Lacrimal pump works by lid
action.

To check diplopia cover one eye -
to red all opaque or plastic show
light. Hold pt. in positions of
red & white lights.

Infrorbital incision to explore
floor of orbit - nasal antrostomy & Foley
catheter inserted in nostril & blown
up under direct vision.

Comp. absence of extensor tendons of
thumb, fingers, or both. Flexor tendons
of ring finger transferred around wrist
& attached to extensor hood.

In arthrography 2 cm. osteotomy of radius
indium pins to wrist lengths of 10 or 15 cm.
or spontaneously become stronger.

WMSO patches on hands, coming out of casts
to speed up early movement. Hefflup antiseptic
wrist transfer. Release of various pins.
debridement of scars, neck deformities of fingers
by color tendons of lateral bands.
