Message From the President

I hope that everyone is off to a happy and healthy start in the New Year. January was a busy month for your President. Wanda Kaye and I visited the Sandestin Golf and Beach Resort to scout it out for our upcoming meeting this June. It truly is a beautiful facility which sits on 2,400 spectacular acres between the Gulf of Mexico and Choctawhatchee Bay. The property where our meeting will be held is actually on the Bay side. However, there are continuous shuttles running to the Sandestin private beach area throughout the day so that beach access should be quite simple.

The accommodations will be either in the Grand Sandestin and its surrounding units or in the properties nearer the village. The Grand Sandestin and its accompanying units have somewhat larger rooms and are a bit more expensive. There are two types of bedrooms available. One has two queen-size beds and other has one queen-size and a nice sitting area. All rooms come with a microwave oven and a small refrigerator. This is important to know, because there is no room service available in this hotel or anywhere on the property. It is a very short walk from the rooms to the village where there are numerous restaurants and other attractions. For

those of you who are planning on bringing children or grandchildren, I have asked the property to set aside a few one, two and three bedroom suites and hold them for our membership along with our other block of rooms. For those interested in suites, I would recommend that you make your accommodations as soon as possible because our allotment of suites will be taken up very quickly I imagine. All the suites have a full kitchen as well as a washer and dryer.

There are four beautiful golf courses on the property and our golf tournament on Monday will be played on the Raven Course which is where the Senior PGA holds an annual event. In fact, the Senior Tour Event is the week before our meeting; therefore, the course should be in great shape for our tournament.

The tennis facilities are world-class with grass, clay and hard surface courts. I have asked Bob Allen to work with the tennis facility pros at Sandestin to put together our tennis tournament this year. The Fun Run will be on
